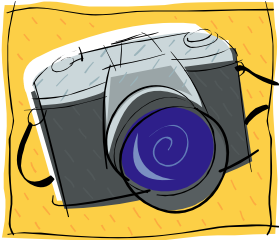

Letter from the President by Walter Harrington

During the next month, we have a housekeeping chore that needs to be addressed. The club bylaw must be updated to remove the references to slides from the document. A committee has been working on this update, and it has submitted its recommendation. Under the club constitution, bylaws governing the transaction of club business may be adopted, revoked, or amended after 14 days notification to the membership and following a two-thirds affirmative vote of a quorum, defined as at least one-third of the paid membership.

Epson SP1400 Large format Photo Printer -

Very lightly used – I bought this printer thinking I would get back into print making after selling my other Epson wide-carriage printer. This printer can make up to 13x19 borderless prints, works very well with both glossy and matte papers. It uses 6 ink cartridges, which means less waste – if one color runs out, you replace that color. The ink is Claria, a dye-based ink that is also used in the Epson PhotoMate. Prints are smudge-free and water resistant, dry instantly and can last up to 200 years.

Note that this ink also does NOT suffer from the classic Epson clogging problem - you can let the printer sit idle for long periods between use.
